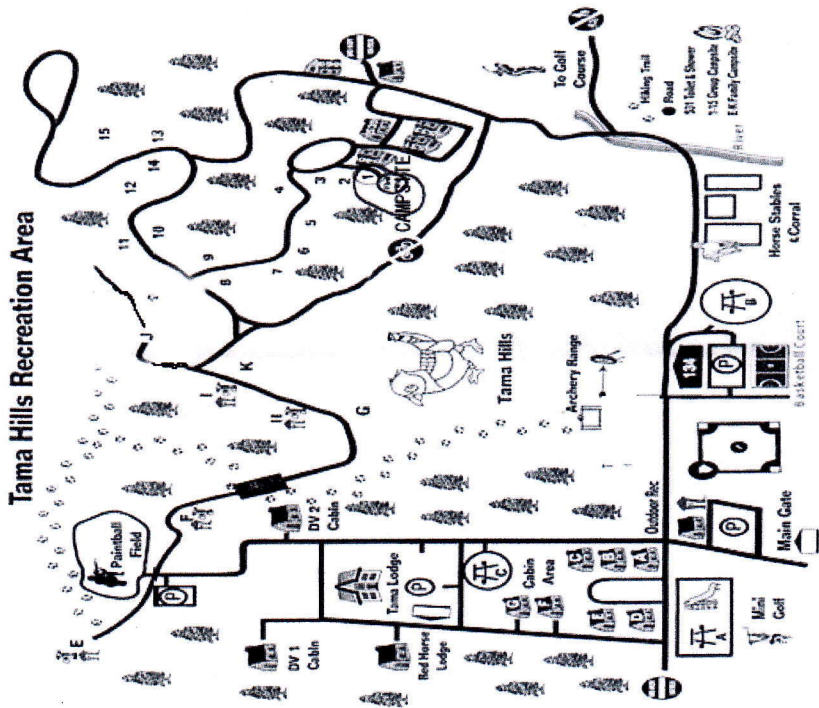


It takes less than one hour by train from Shinjuku to Minamitama Station on the JR Nambu Line.

Try <http://www.hyperdia.com/> to check the train schedule, connections, and costs from yours to Minamitama station.

It generally takes 1 hour or so by car from Shinjuku, depending of course on the traffic.

Note: The campsite area is available from mid-afternoon on Friday until 15:00 on Sunday.



Signing up for the Campout and getting onto the Facility:

Please provide the following information to Larry when registering for the campout: (this info is only for the military security).

- ⇒ Full name
- ⇒ Date of birth
- ⇒ Current address
- ⇒ Nationality (citizens of certain countries require advance clearance for entry, & citizens of some countries may be denied entry).

- ⇒ If you are coming by car, your license plate number, e.g. ke Hachioji 500, 1234
- ⇒ And, for the KPF, your phone or e-mail contact info, and approximately what time you will be coming on Fri or Sat.

Important Notes:

- ⇒ Tama Rec Center is a secure US military facility. Valid up-to-date ID needed and entry only with a certified sponsor from Yokota (KPF). *****For Non-Japanese: you will need your gaijin card (Resident Card) and/or passport*****
- ⇒ **For Japanese citizens:** old-type driver's license (without IC chip) is OK; but, if you have a new-type drivers license (with IC chip and citizenship (本籍) personal info missing), you will need to bring your Japanese passport or other photo ID evidence of Japanese citizenship).
